Key Responsibilities

As a Learning Designer at Aurion Learning, you will be responsible for:

- Owning the relationship with the client team for the design of the digital learning content.
- Designing content plans and storyboards within the agreed project processes and standards that illustrate the structure and content components of the learning resource.
- Liaising with the Learning Development Team for the design of assets such as diagrams, illustrations, characters, and source imagery for the project.
- Liaising with AV specialists, as required, to help scope and support the production of AV requirements.
- Providing progress information to the Project Manager via the appropriate mechanisms so that progress and achievement can be tracked.
- Supporting the development of ideas, concepts, templates, processes, and tools within the team.
- Working across a range of internal and external projects.
